PROMOTE THE EU'S MISSION OCEAN OBJECTIVES

The EU's response to the critical need to revive oceans and rivers is implemented through the "Restore our Oceans and Waters by 2030" Mission. It aims to safeguard biodiversity and mitigate climate change through:

- research and innovation;
- blue investments;
- citizen engagement.

SHORE is dedicated to implementing the Mission Ocean's objectives and help connect citizens, local communities, and schools through education and training activities.









EXPAND THE NETWORK OF EUROPEAN BLUE SCHOOLS

The Network of European Blue schools, initiated by European Ocean Coalition (EU40cean), encourages schools to integrate ocean-related topics into their curriculum, fostering a deeper understanding of marine ecosystems and sustainability among students



SHORE provides comprehensive guidance to schools interested in joining the Network of European Blue Schools.









SHORE'S PRIMARY MISSION

SHORE's primary mission is to enhance Ocean Literacy and to actively engage with students, teachers and schools across five distinct regions:

- Baltic Sea
- Black Sea
- Mediterranean Sea
- Danube River
- Rhine River

Blue curricula toolkits and modules through open schooling methodologies






SHORE'S OPEN CALLS

SHORE will provide grants to 100 school projects on blue sustainability in 3 Open Calls periods.

Participating schools will secure grants to support the implementation of their blue projects (up to 10 000€).







SHORE'S COUNTRY HUBS

Through its **7 Country Hubs** (Austria, Estonia, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Romania, and Turkey) SHORE offers guidance to educators for the implementation of blue projects in schools and provides students with the right skills and knowledge to become eco-citizens.











FOCUS ON SHORE OPEN CALL #1

- Submission: 17 January 20 March 2024 at 17:00 (CET)
- Number of funded projects: 45
- Maximum budget per project: 10,000€
- Duration of a project: Up to 6 months
- Eligible topics: Sea-based activities, Biodiversity, Hazardous substances and marine litter, Climate change, Sustainable use of water resources

Get up to 10,000 € for your blue school project



Receive project mentorship and guidance



Get support from Country Hubs (SHORE project partners regional experts) for successful project implementation, Blue Skills Curricula and open schooling methodologies through a series of meetings and best practices from targeted areas.



Introduce the public about your blue project on the SHORE digital platform





OPEN CALL #1 WHO CAN APPLY?






Elementary and secondary schools (<u>Up to ISCED level 3</u>, commonly designated as upper secondary education)



Legally registered and established in the European Union or <u>Horizon</u> <u>Europe associated countries.</u>

Additionally, schools must be located in one out of five targeted regions of the SHORE – Open Call #1 – Baltic Sea, Black Sea, Mediterranean Sea, Rhine and Danube River Area.

Schools applying for SHORE's Open Calls should be either be:

- a) Accredited members of the European Network of Blue Schools or
- b) Aspire to become a member and will demonstrate how they intend to meet the prerequisites to become accredited members by the time of completion of the project.

SHORE – Open Call #1 is open to schools whose proposal includes a commitment to the European Climate Pact, leading to decarbonisation or at least to carbon neutrality of the project and school activities.








SHORE Submission Platform: Step no. 3 Create a profile on F6S platform

- Our open call only allows for single applicants, such as individual representatives of the school applying for the SHORE programme, who can provide additional information about their background via their F6S profile.
